## **Message from Pastor Jeff:**

Remember Sunday, September 9<sup>th</sup>? It was the start of the church's program year – Church School was in session, special programming was being planned and the public school system was up and running. So, we dedicated backpacks – along with students, support staff, teachers, administrators, and our own church school teachers. We lined the backpacks up on the chancel along the table that holds the cross and candles. There were a lot of them. Following worship, we had delicious Sundaes with all the toppings. It was a great day to start our fall season.

But here's what you might not have known. The deacons knew of one family that was financially struggling. Backpacks might have been out of the question. So the deacons approved the expenditure of \$125 so the children could get backpacks and school supplies. The earth didn't shake. The heavens didn't open. There was no blinding light or blaring siren. Indeed, I suspect that most of us in the church didn't even know this gift had been given. Well, you do now!

Why? There are many things this church does in the community that many of us don't know about. The deacons have provided temporary housing for those with no place to stay. They have supported the efforts of our wonderful town library as it provides food to children who would otherwise be under nourished. It stands ready to assist anyone who is in need and with the winter coming and fuel costs mounting, our deacons are ready to help where help is needed. All of us should know about these efforts and our church's ability to continue to assist others.

You make this possible, you know. Each communion Sunday when you donate to the Deacons Fund you help to finance these efforts. Your generosity has given the deacons the ability to help others in the name of Christ and it truly makes a difference. Thank you.

But I have an additional request. The deacons are a great group of people, but they can only reach out in God's love if they know there is a need. That's where you come in. Let me or a deacon know of anyone who could use some help. We cannot promise that we can be of assistance but it's a sure bet that we can't help if we don't know there is a need. If it is someone in our church, our community or in our world, we want to know. Our church members and friends have been so generous. Help us to make use of the gifts we have received that the mission of the church might be expanded.

One final note, at the Deacons last meeting they approved up to \$250 in matching funds for hurricane relief. That means that if folks give \$250 to this effort, the deacons will match it. All of us were shocked by the devastation visited upon those in the path of Hurricane Florence. And Asia experienced a devastating Typhoon. The need literally reaches around the world. This is one small step we can take to be of help. You will find elsewhere in this edition of the Epistle how to make out your checks. And please, keep the relief efforts in your prayers.

Book Brunch ... a **Mission/Social Action** gathering on September 30<sup>th</sup> Earlier, copies of Alan Gratz's "The Refugee" were handed out and we gathered over a delicious potluck brunch to discuss not only what we found most compelling about the book but also about how we felt compelled to action. A more detailed recap of our great discussion will be published in the November edition.

(about "The Refugee,") A *tour de force* from acclaimed author Alan Gratz (*Prisoner B-3087*), this timely and powerful novel tells the story of three different children seeking refuge.

**Josef** is a Jewish boy living in 1930s Nazi Germany. With the threat of concentration camps looming, he and his family board a ship bound for the other side of the world...

**Isabel** is a Cuban girl in 1994. With riots and unrest plaguing her country, she and her family set out on a raft, hoping to find safety in America...

**Mahmoud** is a Syrian boy in 2015. With his homeland torn apart by violence and destruction, he and his family begin a long trek toward Europe...

All three kids go on harrowing journeys in search of refuge. All will face unimaginable dangers, from drownings to bombings to betrayals. But there is always the hope of tomorrow. And although Josef, Isabel, and Mahmoud are separated by continents and decades, shocking connections will tie their stories together in the end.

Sunday School:

**Where important lessons are taught by caring teachers to kids eager to learn!**

The lesson shown here is that what we say and do has far-reaching consequences for everyone around us.

The figures in the tub represented the kids. Notice that one is in the center right next to a large fizzy tablet. A few drops of colored water on the tablet (a small unkindness by one person) resulted in a fizzy puddle that touched only that one figure. But when the whole group joined in unkind behavior (a larger amount of water on the tablet) they were all engulfed.

It was a powerful message of the importance of kindness and love.

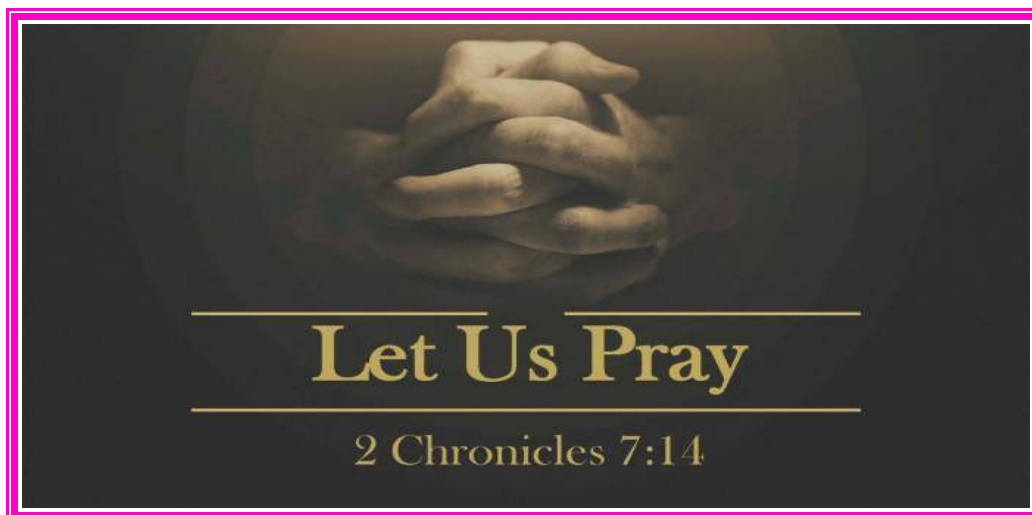
