Message from Pastor Jeff:

I am not a "church growth" expert. Expert or not, growth is at the core of the Christian experience. Failing to grow is failing God. But don't take my word for it. Here's what Jesus had to say following His resurrection and in His final appearance to His followers (Matthew 28:18-20)

"18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

Clear enough. Christians are called to bring people to Christ, to grow the church – the "body of Christ."

There is another facet. Not only are we called to bring people to Christ, we are called to grow in Christ. We've all done this. No one would argue their faith is as it was when they were children. It has changed, been shaped by our lived experience and faced times of doubt that hardened its metal.

So a question comes to mind. Can growth occur without change? No. To grow is to change. I think this is at least in part why God said, "Behold, I make all things new." To grow into the new thing God is doing means we must be open to change.

I mention all this because we are beginning a new year. I do not know what the future holds, but I do know what God expects – growth. So in the days ahead let us seek not what has been, but what God intends. May we, pastor and people, seek to grow the

church and to grow together. May we overcome any fear we might have of change so we might embrace the One who makes all things new.

I haven't selected the music for most of the month as we enter a period of Ordinary Time, but selections will be varied. For Sunday January 13 as a prelude I will play "The Old Year has Passed" from J. S. Bach's Little Organ Book (Orgelbuchlein). The Orgelbuchlein consists of 45 pieces that Bach intended to sharpen the skills of his organ playing kids, and is considered a set of some of his most difficult organ works, even if each piece is short, I believe a case of paternal "tough love" rather than sadism!

One piece of news for you is that I had a successful exploration with Chris Rua (recorder) and Lucy McClellan (Viol di Gamba). We are planning a service after January 1 of music for recorder, gamba, and continuo (organ using less than three stops). I'm learning there are a lot of early music players in the region to tap for services!




