Pastor Jeff is away until the weekend of Feb. 10<sup>th</sup> due to a family emergency. Please keep him and his family in your prayers in this difficult time.

February is most often the month when the Lenten period begins. 2019 is one of the years when it starts in March, giving us a bit of breathing room, liturgically speaking.

In the past our church has hosted or scheduled or presented Lenten programs, Bible Studies, and events. Are there any you recall and would like us to repeat when **Lent begins on March 6<sup>th</sup>**? Some things we've done in the past include a Fat Tuesday pancake supper, a Good Friday prayer vigil, and a Passover Seder. Do you recall something you liked, perhaps at another church? If you do, please contact Pastor Jeff or the Diaconate at the email address listed above.

February is the month we as a church distribute the **Sunshine Bags** into the community to those who have suffered a loss, those who have been in poor health, those who are economically distressed, and those elder members who have been a

vital and active member of the church. The Diaconate assembles and distributes these, usually the Sunday nearest Valentines Day.

A wonderful mission of the Sunday School in recent years has been to make Valentine's cards to include in the bags! (In other years, Ginny Moore's elementary school class has also made absolutely lovely and loving cards!) This year the bags will be dedicated on **Sunday, Feb. 10** and distributed that afternoon. If you can help deliver one or more of the bags, please come forward after worship on the 10<sup>th</sup> and speak to Kathy Munson (or contact her ahead of time to volunteer).



Many folks in the pews on Sunday morning have been, or are related to those who have been Deacons and therefore know the purpose of the Deacon's Fund. For those who are new, yet notice that the little envelopes for this purpose are now placed in the pew-back racks for use anytime, every penny you donate goes to local emergency relief. If you know of someone in need, please do not hesitate to **alert a Deacon or our Care Coordinator Carole Taylor.**

How much and to whom we offer this

support is held in the strictest confidence and the name of the recipient is never recorded in Diaconate minutes.

**Use of the sanctuary:** just as a general rule, any use of the sanctuary is to be arranged with Pastor Jeff first. This is simply traditional protocol so that he always knows for what purpose the worship center is being used and when. He will work with the Trustees on the scheduling. So, if you have a wedding or funeral or concert or speaker requiring the sanctuary, contact Pastor Jeff.

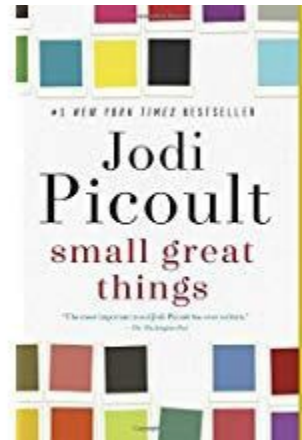
