### Dear Church Family, for the week of March 1<sup>st</sup>

#### **First Sunday of Lent**

Sunday morning worship is at 10:00 a.m.

**Pastor Jeff** tells us: It is tradition that the first Sunday of Lent folks deal with the temptations of Christ. This year, we have been given the narrative found in Matthew 4:1-11.

Then Jesus was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. <sup>2</sup>He fasted forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was famished. <sup>3</sup>The tempter came and said to him, "If you are the Son of God, command these stones to become loaves of bread." <sup>4</sup>But he answered, "It is written, 'One does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." <sup>5</sup>Then the devil took him to the holy city and placed him on the pinnacle of the temple, <sup>6</sup>saying to him, "If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down; for it is written, 'He will command his angels concerning you,' and 'On their hands they will bear you up, so that you will not dash your foot against a stone." <sup>7</sup>Jesus said to him, "Again it is written, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test."<sup>8</sup>Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor; <sup>9</sup>and he said to him, "All these I will give you, if you will fall down and worship me." <sup>10</sup>Jesus said to him, "Away with you, Satan! for it is written, 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him." <sup>11</sup>Then the devil left him, and suddenly angels came and waited on him.

At first blush it may appear that the temptations Jesus faced have little in common with the temptations awaiting us. I suppose that is true in a literal sense, but these temptations point to three areas that we share with Jesus. The first is elemental. We all have to eat, and while I cannot make stones into bread, I can forfeit my calling to follow God's will if by so doing it would make life's struggles easier. The second is spiritual and one that we face regularly. How often has church tempted God? It is easy to see ourselves aligned with God's purpose and to forget that God's ways are not our ways. The final temptation is one that we, too, have known. The evil we perceive in the world needs to be overcome by the goodness of God and we often think that if we could just bring our brand of justice to bear, harmony would descend. We place our vision and agenda above the vision and agenda of God.

So, what may appear arcane is germane and when we meet on Sunday we will attempt to unfold how one might overcome temptation.

Organist **John Atwood** tells us: This week marks the beginning of Lent with music strongly contrasted to last week's bright and loud postlude!
